


Well, here's your answer.

The Confession and Absolution have the Biblical connection to: John 20:19-23 and 1 John 1:8-9.

The Service of the Word has the Biblical connection to several of the Psalms, but the Kyrie is connected to Mark 10:47...the Hymn of Praise to Luke 2:14, John 1:29, Revelation 5:12-13; 19:5-9.

Ok, now that I've got you more interested.

The Salutation and Prayer of the Day are related to the words in 2 Timothy 4:22.

The Old Testament...John 6:68 and Joel 2:13 and the Gospel is also connected there, too.

Skipping the Sermon and Hymn of the Day...we come to the Creed, and it is associated with several of the Apostles' words and the early church established in Antioch.

The Prayers of the Church have been carried on since the writings found in 1 Timothy 2:1-4...the Offering and Offertory to Psalm 116:12-13, 17-19.

The Sacrament [Preface...Sanctus...are connected to 2 Timothy 4:22, Colossians 3:1, psalm 136, Isaiah 6:3, Matthew 21:9.

Whew!

The Lord's Prayer [Prayers of Thanksgiving] Matthew 6:9-13.

More parts of the worship service [as we observe it at St. Peter] like the Pax Domini...Agnus Dei...Distribution...Post Communion Canticle...Collect...Benediction...are related to parts of the Old Testament, but particularly to Numbers 6:24-26.

I hope this 'run-down' proved interesting and if you'd like to pursue more for the feeling of being worship-ful, read Psalm 119:89-96 in your Bible when possible.



Peanut Butter & Jelly

Fabric Kits

Sewing is a valuable skill, one that leads to a reliable income for many women and men. Fabric Kits supply vocational training programs with fabric for teaching sewing, and for newly trained tailors to launch their sewing business.

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN EACH FABRIC KIT:

Two pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (no knits or 100% polyester); fabric should have no stains or holes and be cut into pieces measuring:

- o 2 1/4 yards of 60" wide fabric, or
- o 3 yards of 44" wide fabric, or
- 4 yards of 36" wide fabric
- Two spools of matching or neutral-colored general-purpose thread, 250-300 yards each Cash donations are okay.. please contact Renee Diver @ 309-264-1460 for any questions.
